

BEING BRAVE TOGETHER

“Being Brave Together” is a one day training/retreat format -- originally designed to help transgender community members understand each other and work together better. However, these same skills for cross-cultural engagement are also essential for any workplace.

The “Being Brave Together” framework invites us to bring our whole selves into conscious relationship with each other, acknowledging difference, challenge, triggers, as well as connection, resourcefulness, and resilience. The “Being Brave Together” seminar for non-profits introduces that framework for your group.

Bringing all of who we are into the room isn’t always easy as we come from different backgrounds, religious and racial experiences, gender identities and expressions, abilities and challenges. All of these (and more) impact the way that we work together in fundamental ways, shaping the assumptions and expectations we make of one another.

In a majority culture, it takes a particular kind of bravery to be fully present and to welcome others in their authenticity. AND YET, when we are all able to bring our authentic selves to the work we do together, we are so much stronger for the effort.

Being present and building trust in diverse communities involves taking some risks. It would be much simpler to go it alone! By being brave together, we open ourselves to the collective wisdom and healing that comes from being fully **together**.
